The past year has rendered our U.S. Team Partnerships nearly non-existent. And we understand the reasons for that. However, Bill has managed to continue good progress in many areas by employing Haitian helpers. But he and Sandy miss the fellowship, shared labors, and benefits of our U.S. brothers and sisters.

We are hoping that we can reboot and begin to get things back to normal with our team partnerships. We are praying that God would once more place a burden and a calling on His people to come to Haiti and come alongside Bill and Sandy in the work. There are several areas where we have the need to re-start ...

- there is a constant need for fresh paint on our numerous buildings. It is like cutting grass ... we just seem to get everything looking good and we need to start over again. So we need **paint teams!** We can probably accommodate you on the dates. They are flexible.
- we would also like to restart our **Pastor's Schools.**
- and we need to restart our **Medical Teams.** They serve our student body. The target dates for the next medical teams will be Tue Nov 2 - Tue Nov 9, 2021 and Tue Apr 12 - Tue Apr 19, 2022.

One important change is that American Airlines has quit flying into Cap Haitien. The best flight available to us at present is with Missionary Flights Int'l. out of Ft. Pierce, FL. This adds some days to the trip for people that will have to commute to Ft. Pierce the day before departure. Spirit Air is flying into Cap Haitien, but the schedule is very difficult.



These three preachers worked together to develop their theme for the week ... *"Fixing Our Eyes on Jesus"*.
